Dear ICC leadership:

The City of Minneapolis received email notification that the 2021 IECC voting process is being questioned. As a city we have strengthened our ICC membership in recognition that the ICC's building codes and standards are central to protecting people's health and safety in the built environment. Our sustainability office sets energy policy and funds programs to promote efficiency in our city's homes and buildings. Highly efficient, resilient buildings are a component of health and safety, and we are pleased to have increased our participation in the ICC's voting process this cycle.
