I'm a long-time member of the International Code Council and I would like to support the idea of moving the development of the *International Energy Conservation Code* to an ANSI-based process. I can see only upside by moving to a true consensus-based development process that allows for a balance of interests to have equal say on the committee.

The last cycle (2021) of development of the IECC resulted in eleventh-hour reversals of actions that were taken during the previous steps of development. Is it really fair to all parties concerned and society at large if concentrated lobbying efforts by persons or entities who stand to benefit financially or otherwise result in a tipping of the scales in their favor? Even if only to help stop this scenario from occurring, the switch to a consensus-based ANSI process would be a good thing.
