Scope:



The Certified Fire Marshal is responsible for the development, administration, interpretation, application, and enforcement of the codes adopted by their jurisdiction. They will be able to manage their department's budget and the certification and training of inspection staff. They will have an understanding of laws and regulations pertaining to human resources. They will have a thorough knowledge of customer service, develop and maintain effective relationships with all client groups, and be able to effectively communicate with contractors, homeowners, subordinates, superiors, news media, elected officials, and civic organizations.

The Certified Fire Marshal shall be able to develop, administer and deliver Fire Prevention and Public Fire Safety Programs for their jurisdiction through support from governing bodies and the community. The Certified Fire Marshal will be able to administer and conduct fire scene investigations utilizing recognized methods of investigation and procedures.

The Certified Fire Marshal shall be responsible for developing and implementing programs that provide for inspections of occupancies for life safety and fire issues including, but not limited to, interior finish, occupancy type, height and area limitations, construction type, and general fire safety, in accordance with Codes and Standards adopted by their jurisdiction. The Certified Fire Marshal shall develop and implement programs for plan review and permitting to ensure compliance with adopted Codes and Standards and enforcement.
